DIVISION OF AGING SERVICES

The federal Administration on Aging awards Older Americans Act funds to the Georgia Department of Human Services Division of Aging Services (DAS). The funds are for supportive home and community based services. In addition to funding critical nutrition and supportive services, the funds are for elder rights programs, including the Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program, legal services, outreach, and elder abuse prevention efforts. The Division designated 12 planning and service areas called Area Agencies on Aging (AAA). The Division and the AAAs tailor programs to meet the specific needs of older persons residing in those areas.

VOLUNTEER AND INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITES WITH THE AREA AGENCIES ON AGING

The 12 Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) are the gateway to community resources for older adults to find housing, attend senior centers, receive home-delivered meals, locate and attend adult day care, get information on Medicare, Medicaid and prescription assistance programs and more. Placement opportunities exist at the local AAA depending on the type of projects, the work available, the interests, and qualifications of the individual.

ELDER ABUSE AND CONSUMER FRAUD PREVENTION

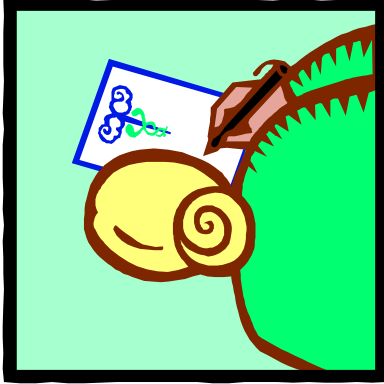

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES REQUIRING SPECIFIC TRAINING

GEORGIA CARES

GeorgiaCares helps people with Medicare understand their choices and get the most out of your healthcare benefits. This program is the State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) and SMP. GeorgiaCares provides individual one-on-one counseling, community education and outreach about:

TYPES OF VOLUNTEERS

GeorgiaCares' volunteer program is called *PEACH* Pals. An individual can volunteer to be a *Partner, Educator, Administrator, Counselor* or *Hero*. It is a requirement that *PEACH* Pals commit at least 4 hours per month for at least six months to the GeorgiaCares Program.

VOLUNTEER AND INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

LONG-TERM CARE OMBUDSMAN PROGRAM

A *Long-Term Care Ombudsman* seeks to improve the quality of life of residents of nursing homes and personal care homes.

SPECIFIC VOLUNTEER DUTIES:

- * Visit residents; identify complaints and concerns.
- * Monitor facilities for residents' rights issues as well as for resident care and staffing concerns, while maintaining confidentiality.
- * Identify issues, complaints and concerns that should be referred to a Staff Ombudsman.
- * Encourage self-advocacy and interaction among residents and between residents, staff and the community.
- * Submit monthly report. Attend required training.

TYPES OF VOLUNTEER OMBUDSMAN:

Volunteer Visitor: Volunteer Visitors provide essential support to Staff Ombudsmen by visiting residents, identifying problems and making referrals. Training provided at local level.

- * *Certified Volunteer Ombudsman:* A Certified Volunteer Ombudsman is authorized to conduct complaint investigations. Training requirements include 24 hours of classroom training, 10 days of documented field visits and passing grades on written and oral exams.
- * *Note:* All volunteer ombudsman positions require a background check.

VOLUNTEERS are also sought for clerical assistance at the state office and many local offices.

INTERNSHIPS:

Nonpaid internships in our state office in downtown Atlanta may be available to undergraduate and graduate students specializing in an aging or aging-related field. Intern projects may include but are not limited to: public policy, volunteer development, and event planning.
